What We Do Together

Grants Received

Central Peace Fire Commission \$50,000 for study and \$345,000 for implementation

Central Peace Health Center. \$200,000 for Feasibility & \$150,000 for Governance

Central Peace Seniors Housing \$250,000 for Feasibility

Regional Water Supply \$250,000 for Feasibility

Provincial Governments are encouraging that we work together and are willing to throw money to these projects.







Central Peace Attraction & Retention Committee

- We were and still are the most stable community for doctors in the North West.
