When to start posting

Rural health care is important seven days a week and 365 days of the year. Start posting about rural health care any time and use the hashtags #RuralHealthMatters, and #ABRuralHealthWeek, as soon as you'd like. We want to boost the rural health-care conversation across all of Alberta and let people know about ARHW as soon as possible.

Glossary

What is a hashtag?

Simply put, a hashtag (#) is any word or phrase immediately preceded by the # symbol (e.g., #RuralHealthMatters). When you click on a hashtag, you'll see other Tweets containing the same keyword or topic.

- Hashtags can be searched for in any search function.
- Hashtags “trend.” When they trend, it means lots of Twitter users are using the same hashtag to talk about a certain topic. (Help us get #RuralHealthMatters to trend in Canada!)
- Hashtags are used on Twitter, Facebook, and Instagram.

What is @?

- The @ symbol is used to tag users in Twitter.
- It also can be referred to as a mention.

What's tagging (or a mention)?

You can mention other users in your Twitter, Facebook, Instagram by using the @ symbol followed by their username. If you do so, they will be notified of the tag.
