

Rural VIP No. 21: Virtual Health Care



Half of respondents have been offered a virtual health care appointment by their primary care provider since the COVID-19 pandemic began.

One in five respondents indicated that if a virtual health care appointment was not an option, they would have waited until the pandemic situation improved before seeking care.





Only **three per cent** of respondents have had a virtual visit through a third-party platform. These respondents either did not have a primary care provider, or their provider did not offer virtual visits.

Three-quarters of respondents indicated that their preference for an in-person or virtual appointment depends on their health concern.





82 per cent of respondents would like virtual health care visits to be an option beyond the COVID-19 pandemic.
