Hidden Gem! The Golden Triangle Snowmobile Trail is a loop that connects the communities of Fox Creek, Whitecourt and Swan Hills in northeastern Alberta. The total distance of the trail is 220 miles through semi-alpine forest, but it also accesses thousands of miles of secondary trails, year-round campgrounds, and ice-fishing lakes.
