Did You Know? Castor's Our Lady of the Rosary Hospital dates back to 1911 and has also served as a convent and a boarding school over its lifetime. Originally ran by six French speaking nuns, it was at one point the only hospital between Red Deer and Moose Jaw. While the original structure still stands, its' many empty spaces host whisperings of ghost stories and has garnered a reputation for being notoriously haunted.

Hidden Gem! Castor began as a small prairie town in 1910 and has stayed true to its old-fashioned small-town roots. History buffs can travel back in time at the Train Station Museum, displaying everything from a dentist office to a family home filled with artifacts from days gone by. What was originally a working drug store is now showcased as The Pharmacy Museum and is home to the most extensive collection of early turn of the century items from general merchandise to veterinary items to cosmetics and toiletries.
