Did You Know? Fort Vermilion is one of the oldest settlements in Alberta. The mighty Peace River was the original highway, first to and from Fort Chipewyan to the east and later, between Fort Vermilion and Peace River to the south. This community is rich in both history and beauty.







Did You Know? AHS contracts 11 fixed-wing aircraft to provide 24-hour air ambulance services throughout the province, and Fort Vermilion has one of those bases. Air ambulances are tightly integrated with ground ambulances since both are part of the health system, with consistent medical direction and an integrated dispatch system.
