Did You Know? Coming to homestead in Oyen in 1013, Dr. H.C. Swartzlander put himself through college and served as the community's first physician, with the support of a local midwife for deliveries. In 1924 he bought a house and renovated it to include space for an operating room and large ward. Oyen's first municipal hospital opened in 1947 located on the present hospital grounds.

Hidden Gem! Oyen Crossroads Museum: This museum consists of nine buildings that all have specific themes to highlight the history of the area through the artifacts housed inside, plus an escape room to try out. Here you will find the old Westside School, a 1917 farmhouse that was built near Sibbald, Alberta, the Ukrainian Catholic Church built in 1914, a one-room schoolhouse during the early 1900s, a 1935 Blacksmith shop, a cooking car from the railroad in the 1920s, and a machinery shed that features a Model T Ford, a 1928 Hart-Parr and more.
